Mirona studied art and journalism in Romania and continued her academic studies in Ireland, where she moved in 2003, and graduated with a first class Honours Degree in Fine Art.

Ciara Roche is a recipient of Visual Arts - Arts Council and ArtLinks bursaries and was shortlisted for the biannual Hennessy Craig Award with the Royal Hibernian Academy in 2022; she won the Éigse Graduate Prize for outstanding work in VISUAL with Carlow Arts Festival in 2020.
